



An interview with **Shereece Storrod**

Black Voices have been Associate Artists for B:Music since 2005 and boasts an impressive performance history globally.



"Performing for the Pope in Laureto has to be up there," says singer-songwriter and Artistic Director of Black Voices, **Shereece Storrod**. But her heart lies in Birmingham. "It's weird because we do so many big things, you know, Ray Charles, Nina Simone - whilst it was all amazing, sometimes I like the lowkey gigs. Sometimes when we're just here at the Jennifer Blackwell Performance **Space**, getting to perform for the people of Birmingham. And when we do things like **Community Spirit**, and we get to work with other choirs and vocal groups."

The all-female acapella quintet is no stranger to Town Hall and Symphony Hall. "It's always "wow" when you tell people that you're performing at Symphony Hall, but Town Hall always feels like home for **Black Voices**. It's where our journey and our relationship with B:Music began many, many years ago - even before there was a Symphony Hall."

With three upcoming performances in 2023 across both venues and the Jennifer Blackwell Performance Space. **Black Voices** promises to show different sides to their music this year. "[We're loving the new Jennifer Blackwell Performance Space and the different types of audiences that we get to encounter in that space. I love the intimacy of being able to be close to the audience and interact with them more."



A year since **Beyond the Bricks of Brum**...

On June 17 2022, under the baton of Principal Guest Conductor, **Dalia Stasevska**, and featuring arrangements and orchestrations by **Jules Buckley**, the **BBC Symphony Orchestra** played brand new arrangements and compositions alongside **Black Voices, Casey Bailey** and **Sanity** at Symphony Hall. Featuring over 100 musicians, this celebration of Birmingham's music and spoken word scene was called **Beyond the Bricks of Brum**.

"From an early stage in our planning for the Birmingham 2022 Festival at **B:Music**, we wanted to ensure that we used this opportunity to champion the musical, spoken word and poetry talent from Birmingham on a global scale whilst the eyes of the world were on our city for the Commonwealth Games," says B:Music's Head of Programme, **Chris Proctor**. "The pinnacle of this resulted in **Beyond the Bricks of Brum**, alongside supporting other key Festival initiatives that celebrated the city such as On Record, Key to the City and the Victoria Square Festival Site, in partnership with other organisations like Birmingham Music Archive. Fierce Festival and OPUS."

"Performing at Symphony Hall as part of the **Beyond the Bricks of Brum** was an unforgettable experience for me. Collaborating with the **BBC Symphony Orchestra** and other incredible musicians



and poets to celebrate Birmingham and the midlands was a true blessing," poet and rapper **John Bernard** recalls. "The year prior to my performance, I recall walking past the Symphony Hall and expressing to my friend my desire to, one day, have the opportunity to perform there. As fate would have it, a few months later, I received the news that I would indeed have the chance to grace the Symphony Hall stage!"

"Working on **Beyond the Bricks of Brum** was a real career highlight! To share the stage with an orchestra whose size was only surpassed by its quality and number of the shining lights of the Birmingham performing scene was a privilege and a blessing," echoes **Casey Bailey**.

One year on, these artists have found success in and beyond Birmingham. "I've been on a UK tour, performed at Shambala & Godiva festival, also currently supporting youth organisations by doing 1-2-1 music mentoring," says **John Bernard**.

"Since Beyond the Bricks of Brum I've been straight back to work," **Casey Bailey** says. "My poetry pamphlet *From This Soil* was published by The Broken Spine, so check that out!"


